On Education Funding by Washington State

At the start of your school year, did **certain questions** seem all too familiar?

- Why is my kid's class size so large?
 - Why doesn't my school have a librarian, counselor or nurse?
 - Why can't kids bring their textbooks home to study?
 - Why aren't there **more electives** for kids to take?
 - Why aren't the **athletic facilities** better maintained?
 - Why can't the **school bus take kids home** from their after-school activities?

We know that **the lack of dollars** has something to do with the answers.

But, why? Is the shortfall at the district or state level? Is it just our school district, or is the problem widespread? Is anyone doing anything about it? **What can we do?**
